Spring Cleanup Day—May 20th

Hours for the clean-up are 7:00 a.m.—11:30 a.m. on Saturday, May 20th. Only residents of the City of Jordan will be allowed to dropoff items. Sandcreek Township residents will no longer be included in the Cleanup Day. There is

no charge to Jordan residents. Please provide your driver's license for address verification.

Items accepted: dehumidifiers, dishwashers, dryers, freezers, furnaces, garbage disposals, humidifiers, microwaves, refrigerators, stoves, trash compactors, washers, water heaters, furniture, batteries, tires, electronics, grills, lawnmowers and snow blowers (with gas and oil removed), etc. Questions—contact DSI at 952-469-2239 or City Hall at 952-492-2535.

Items not accepted: No yard waste or household hazardous waste will be accepted. Please note on page # 2 in the newsletter your yard waste options.

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DSI—Yard Waste Options

Dick's Sanitation Inc. (DSI) has the following three options available regarding yard waste disposal:

Option 1 Co-mingled yard waste and organics

- Year round service
- Usage of a 65 gallon cart
- Weekly collection of organics and yard waste combined
- Would include up to 10 additional compostable bags or bundles of brush

Option 2 Seasonal yard waste

- Seasonal service (April to November)
- Usage of 65 gallon cart
- Weekly collection of yard waste
- Would include up to 10 additional compostable bags or bundles of brush
- Yearly cost of \$90 for 2017

Option 3 On call yard waste

- Seasonal service (April to November)
- Services required to be called in prior to service day
- Per bag charge of \$3.00 for 2017



DSI will provide one free curbside yard waste pickup on **Saturday, November 4th**. Please place your yard waste in compostable bags and have curbside by 7:00 a.m.

Other Yard Waste Options



1. Scott County residents can drop off yard waste for **free** from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. every Sunday from April 2-May 28 at Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community's Organics Recycling Facility, located at 1905 Mystic Lake Drive South in Shakopee. You must bring a driver's license or state ID card. Call 952-233-9191 or visit www.smscorf.com. for more information.

2. The Mulch Store located at 14800 Johnson Memorial Drive (Hwy 169) Shakopee will also accept yard waste. They are open from 7 am.—4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Closed Saturday and Sunday. They charge \$1 bag for yard waste and \$8 per cubic yard for brush. For more information, visit their website at mulchstoremn.com or call 952-445-2139.

SW Interceptor Project



The project will begin the middle of May and should be substantially completed by November 30, 2017. Portions of Valley View Drive and W 195th Street will be closed during construction. These closures will be temporary while the contractor installs utilities under the roadway. Residents will be informed of closures prior to the closure taking place. The contractor and City will try their best to accommodate residents' access to their homes.

Minnesota law requires all owners to **provide insurance information** when registering, re-registering or transferring ownership of a vehicle. Information required: insurance company's name, policy number, and policy expiration date. **Tabs cannot be issued unless the insurance information is available.**

DOG LICENSES

PARK AND RECREATION ADVISORY COMMISSION APPROVES NEW SIGNAGE FOR PARKS

In the beginning of 2016, Jordan's Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC) began efforts to rebrand Jordan's parks with new signs. After a year of research, feedback, and consultation with Jordan's Master Parks, Trails and Natural Resource Plan, the PRAC selected signs designed and fabricated by the company Fast Signs. Lagoon and Holzer Parks will get new 48" x 96" signs while Brentwood, Timberline, Riesgraf-Lions, Fireman's, Pekarna, Bridle Creek, and Sawmill Woods parks will get new 30" x 60" signs. Moving forward, the city will continue to order signs for remaining parks, or parks with multiple access points, in order to maintain a cohesive appearance for all users. With timeless design, durable materials, and a classic Jordan color scheme, the Jordan's Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission has ensured that the signs serve Jordan's parks for years to come.

Watering Requirements

There are watering restrictions seven days a week, year round in Jordan. The restrictions include the odd/even system, plus time restrictions.

- Customers whose home or business address ends with an odd number may sprinkle the lawn only on odd numbered days.
- Customers whose home or business address ends with an even number may sprinkle the lawn only on even numbered days.

No sprinkling is permitted between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. A 30-day exception will be allowed for new seed or sod.

Remember most lawns need only 1" of water a week. The best time to water is between 3-9 a.m. when it is the coolest and the least amount of wind. If you notice someone watering illegally, please contact the Police Department.
