### File for election to the Jordan City Council!

#### CITY COUNCIL CANDIDATE FILINGS OPEN IN JULY

The Candidate filing period will be open from July 31, 2018 to August 14, 2018 for three (3) Council seats. These positions are all four year terms beginning in January of 2019.

#### **HOW TO FILE FOR OFFICE:**

To apply for one of the vacancies on the City Council, you must fill out an application at City Hall located at 210 E. 1st Street from July 31st to August 14th between the hours of 8:30 and 5:00 p.m. The following criteria must be met to file for office:

- ♦ The candidate must be an eligible voter
- ♦ The candidate will have maintained residence in the city for 30 days before the election
- The candidate must pay the \$2 filing fee at the time of filing
- ♦ The candidate is, or will be on assuming the office, 21 years of age or more.

The Councilmembers receive a monthly stipend of \$300. For more information, please contact City Hall.

#### **ELECTION SIGNS**

Election season is upon us! Candidates and people concerned about issues will soon be putting up signs supporting their positions. Both Minnesota Statutes and the Jordan City Code regulate these signs. Here is a summary of the regulations.

<u>Safety issues can be created by the location of a sign</u>. The City Code requires signs placed on corner lots to be set back 25 feet from the corner. Signs cannot be placed on or over a public right-of-way or any publicly owned property, including boulevard trees and utility poles. Signs may be attached to a permanent, not temporary fence, and cannot interfere with traffic visibility.

<u>The City Code prohibits various types of signs that are deemed too distracting or increase light pollution</u>. Prohibited signs include: flashing signs and signs with twinkling illumination; signs emitting a beam of light, including search lights; rooftop signs, rotating signs or billboards; mobile signs.

RE-REGISTRATION: If you are currently registered to vote, you do not need to register again unless you have:

- Moved to a different address (if you submit a permanent forwarding order with the U.S. Postal Service, your voter registration may automatically be updated to your new address. You will receive a postcard notification).
- Changed your name
- Not voted at least once within the last four years

#### DO YOU NEED CAR TABS?

Minnesota law requires all owners to provide insurance information when registering, re-registering or transferring ownership of a vehicle. Information required: insurance company's name, policy number, and policy expiration date. Tabs cannot be issued unless the insurance information is available.



#### **BOULEVARD TREET TRIMMING**

is the responsibility of the owners of property abutting the right of way where boulevard trees are located. Property owners are required to obtain permission from the city to remove or treat boulevard trees, however permission is not necessary for routine trimming. If you are concerned about the health of your boulevard tree, please call City Hall.

#### FREE YARD WASTE PICKUP

The next curbside yard waste pickup is scheduled for Saturday, November 3rd. Please place your yard waste in compostable bags and have them curbside by 7:00 a.m.

DSI will pick up bags of yard waste and bundles of brush curbside or in the alley. Yard waste consists of grass clippings and leaves. Brush consists of limbs 6" or less in diameter and the bundles of

#### Watering Requirements

There are watering restrictions seven days a week, year round in Jordan. The restrictions include the odd/even system, plus time restrictions.

- Customers whose home or business address ends with an odd number may sprinkle the lawn only on odd numbered days.
- Customers whose home or business address ends with an even number may sprinkle the lawn only on even numbered days.

No sprinkling is permitted between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. A 30-day exception will be allowed for new seed or sod.

Remember most lawns need only 1" of water a week. The best time to water is between 3-9 a.m. when it is the coolest and the least amount of wind. If you notice someone watering illegally, please contact the Police Department.
