## Progress in Jordan—Brentwood Terrace

The Scott County Community Development Agency (CDA) recently broke ground to begin construction of a 59-unit 55+ apartment building in the City of Jordan. This project, called Brentwood Terrace, is the second phase of senior apartments funded by the Scott County CDA.

Brentwood Terrace represents a significant investment in the City of Jordan and an opportunity for older Jordan residents to continue to live in the community even as they transition to a different type of housing. The 59-unit project is made up of Studio, 1 and 2-bedroom units along with amenities including a salon, club room, and fitness and community rooms.



The project is not just a win for the City's older residents, however. Housing stock currently occupied by older residents can be a perfect example of what is known as "naturally occurring affordable housing" (NOAH). As older residents age out of their homes, those homes become available to younger residents. They're often more affordable for homebuyers than a newly constructed home.

A public groundbreaking was held on November 18<sup>th</sup>. Completion of Brentwood Phase 2 is expected sometime in early 2021.

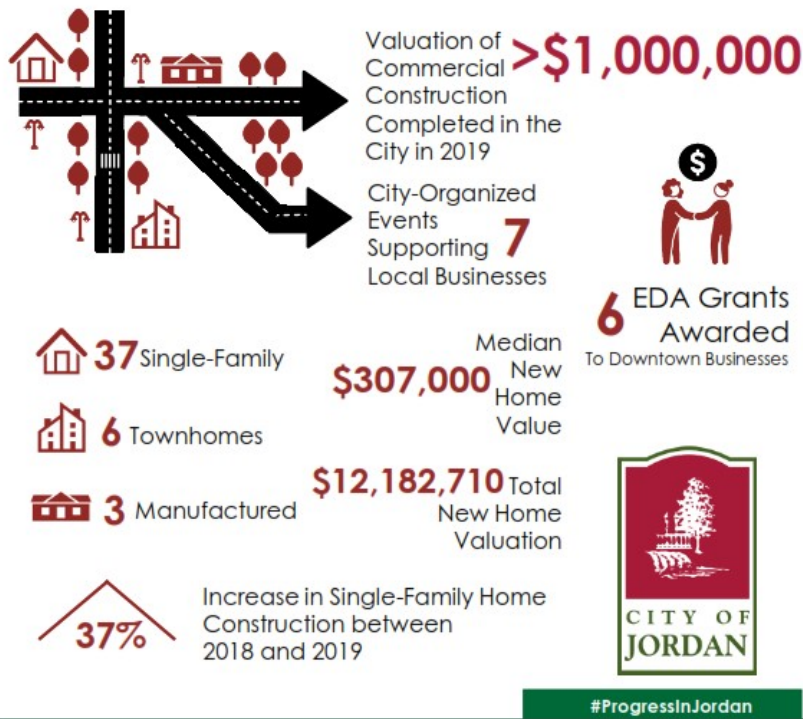
### PLEASE NOTE:

**Items accepted:** dehumidifiers, dishwashers, washers, microwaves, dryers, freezers, furnaces, garbage disposals, refrigerators, stoves, trash compactors, water heaters, tires, electronics, grills, (lawnmowers & snow blowers drained of all fluids or they will not be accepted). List is not all inclusive.

## Consider Going Organic

Organic materials, which include food and compostable paper, make up about 25% of our trash by weight! Participating in an organics recycling program keeps food scraps and other compostable materials out of the trash. Instead of going to the landfill or incinerator, this organic material can be used to replenish soil, reduce erosion, and prevent polluted storm water runoff from contaminating wetlands, lakes and streams.

The City of Jordan offers a free organics recycling drop off site for all residents. The organics recycling site is at 705 Syndicate St. Some items include: paper egg cartons, paper bags, napkins, paper towels, pizza boxes, certified compostable & take-out containers, animal bedding, coffee, and food scraps. ## Progress Update: Mousse Sparkling Wine

Construction is well underway at 115 First Street East, in what will soon be the home of Mousse Sparkling Wine. Mousse will feature a wine bar, and indoor and outdoor seating where patrons can enjoy the still and sparkling wine and hard cider produced on site. In addition to



flights, glasses and bottles of wine and cider, small plates and accoutrements such as charcuterie and cheese will be sold.

The building, historically known as the Langer Building, is currently undergoing major renovation to accommodate the future winery and tasting room. 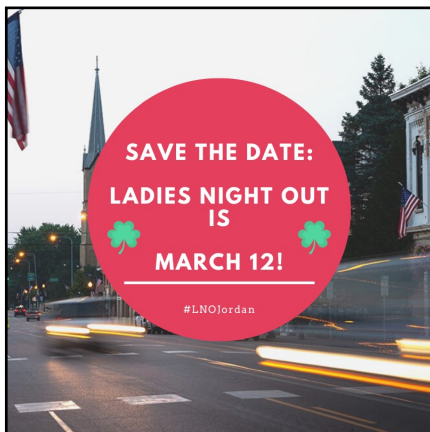

## 2020 Elections Schedule

With the Presidential Nomination Primary (PNP) election behind us, we can turn our attention to two more elections during 2020 for you to participate in. Be sure to mark your calendars for the Primary Election being held on August 11, 2020, and the General Election which is being held on November 3, 2020. Election Day Polling for all elections are held at the CERC, 500 Sunset Drive, Jordan, Minnesota. Election Day Polls open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m.

New to the City of Jordan this year is the introduction of Absentee Voting. Minnesota no longer requires a reason to be eligible to absentee vote. For both Precincts 1 and 2, absentee voting begins 46 days prior to election day and is offered at City Hall during normal business hours. Absentee voting for the Primary is June 26-August 10, and the General Election absentee voting is September 18-November 2. Extended hours of absentee voting is also offered the Saturday before each Election Day Voting at City Hall from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. For more information or to become an election judge, contact Mary at [mlein@jordanmn.gov](mailto:mlein@jordanmn.gov) or call 952-492-7931.
