Council Approves Splash Pad Installation in Lagoon Park

At their March 19th meeting, the Jordan City Council approved the splash pad design to be installed in Lagoon Park this summer. The Park and Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC) has been reviewing different plans and features for the splash pad over the past few months and arrived at a final design produced by Webber Recreation and Design2Play.

The selected design was chosen for its durable materials (powder-coated steel), integration of age specific play zones (appropriate for all ages), and innovation in creativity and eye-catching design. The splash pad will be located north of the playground, and south of the bathrooms at Lagoon Park.

Elements of the splash pad design includes:

- Broom- finished concrete which is easy to clean and provides traction
- A combination of features including ground sprays, columns/uprights, overhead dumping/spraying and interactive features
- Limestone blocks will provide definition to the area and serve as both a barrier and seating
- Initially five lounge chairs will be installed along with four benches

Water usage will be controlled through the command center. The amount of water used will be tracked by a water meter. The use of the splash pad will be restricted to warmer months and days when the temperature is 65 degrees or above. <u>(THE SPLASH PAD</u> WILL NOT INCREASE YOUR WATER BILLS)!

Estimated project cost is \$175,000. These funds are available from the generous donation of longtime Jordan resident and parks patron, Jiv Pauly. Once the contract is executed, the splash pad should be delivered and installed within 12-15 weeks.

am.—11:30 a.m. on **Saturday, May 19th**. Only <u>residents</u> of the City of Jordan will be allowed to dropoff items. Sandcreek Township residents will no longer be included in the Cleanup Day. There is <u>**no**</u> charge to Jordan residents.

Items accepted: dehumidifiers, dishwashers, dryers, freezers, furnaces, garbage disposals, humidifiers, microwaves, refrigerators, stoves, trash compactors, washers, *mattresses/boxsprings, water heaters, furniture, batteries, tires, electronics, grills, (lawnmowers and snow blowers drained of all fluids or they will not be accepted). **List is not all inclusive.**

Sand Creek Dog Park

Jordan's dog park is located at the intersection of Sawmill Road and O'Day Drive. Hours are 6 am to 10 pm. Please clean up after your pets.

Seasonal Park Maintenance/Concession Stand Workers Needed

The City of Jordan will be accepting applications for five seasonal park maintenance/concession stand workers. Employees would be required to work some nights and weekends. Job duties include general maintenance of City Parks including mowing and trimming as well as working in the concession stand. Applicants must be at least 16 years old and have a valid Minnesota Drivers license. Starting salary will be \$11.00 per hour. Applications can be picked up at City Hall Monday-Friday from 8:30-5:00. Street Sweeping

Street sweeping will start the middle of April so make sure vehicles are not parked on the street during this time. Keep an eye out for signs in your neighborhood indicating that the sweepers will be there.

Fire Hydrant Flushing

Publics Works will be flushing hydrants in April through May. Watch for information on the City's website and signs in your neighborhood for specific dates when the flushing will occur. If you have rusty water, turn on the outside faucets first and then all inside faucets and flush your systems. The water should clear in 10 minutes.
