In the past, registered block parties occur between 6 to 9 p.m. and have been visited by representatives of the Jordan Police and Fire departments, Allina and Ridgeview ambulance services, McGruff the crime fighting dog, the American Red Cross, and many other public safety organizations.

Block captains are responsible for organizing a block party on the night of the event. Block parties can be as small or large as the captains can manage and are typically a potluck or an inexpensive cookout promoting neighborhood spirit.

Lagoon Park Shelter



This schematic drawing shows the new park shelter that is being constructed in Lagoon Park. The Jordan Area Lions recently donated \$20,000 for the 24' x 32' shelter that is on the south side of Lagoon Park.

The shelter will consist of a bathroom, countertop kitchen space and dining area. There will be garage doors on opposite sides of the building which will allow the building to open to the outdoors. Estimated completion date is sometime in September.

Where Do I Vote?



The polling place location has changed for City of Jordan residents. The new location is 500 Sunset Drive at the Community Education Recreation (CERC).

The Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, August 9th from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. and the General Election is Tuesday, November 8th. There are two precincts in Jordan– Precinct 1 is the area south of TH 282 and Precinct 2 is the area north of TH 282.

RE-REGISTRATION: If you are currently registered to vote, you do not need to register again unless you have:

- Moved to a different address (if you submit a permanent forwarding order with the U.S. Postal Service, your voter registration may automatically be updated to your new address. You will receive a postcard notification).
- Changed your name
- Not voted at least once within the last four years

City Council Candidate Filings Open in August

Candidate filings will be open August 2-August 16 for the four seats soon to be open on the City Council. The openings include the Mayor and three Councilmembers. These positions are all four year terms beginning in January of 2017. **HOW TO FILE FOR OFFICE:**

To apply for one of the vacancies on the City Council, you must fill out an application at City Hall located at 210 E. 1st Street from August 2 through August 16 between the hours of 8:30 and 5:00 p.m. The following criteria must be met to file for office:

- The candidate must be an eligible voter
- The candidate will have maintained residence in the city for 30 days before the election
- The candidate must pay the \$2 filing fee at the time of filing
- The candidate is, or will be on assuming the office, 21 years of age or more.

The Mayor receives a monthly stipend of \$400 and the Councilmembers \$300. For more information, please contact City Hall.

Things You Should Know

DO YOU NEED CAR TABS!

Minnesota law requires all owners to **provide insurance information** when registering, re-registering or transferring ownership of a vehicle. Information required: insurance company's name, policy number, and policy expiration date. Tabs cannot be issued unless the insurance information is available.

NEW RESIDENTIAL GARBAGE CONTRACT

The Jordan City Council approved the new Garbage Contract with Dick's Sanitation Inc. (DSI) at their July 18th Council meeting. Dick's Sanitation will be the City of Jordan's new residential refuse hauler beginning in January of 2017. The term of the contract is five years.

Dick's Sanitation bid was \$500,000 less than the current hauler's bid over the life of the five year contract. Some of the highlights of the new contract include:

- Free public drop-off of cardboard at a tbd location
- One year free residential trash and recycling services to any service person that is in "active duty" in the military
- One-day 4 hour (free) bulky item drop-off
- Annual fall leaf collection day to be serviced at no charge
- The bag service is being eliminated, but residents with less garbage can have every other week pickup of their cart
- Seasonal yard waste carts with weekly pickup will be an option for customers
- No shutoff of service
- Added another week to pay bills and set a limit on late fees
- Snowbird option for residents
- Organics
- No fuel surcharge
- No dumping fee

YARD WASTE DATES



Elite Waste Disposal will provide yard waste and brush pick up on the following Saturdays: August 13th, October 22nd, and November 5th. **You must use compostable bags**. Elite Waste Disposal will pick up bags of yard waste and bundles of brush curbside or in the alley. (Please ensure that all bags or bundles are out by 7:00 a.m.) Yard waste consists of grass clippings and leaves. Brush consists of limbs 6" or less in diameter and the bundles of brush can be up to five feet long and one foot wide. Valley Green yard waste is handled by a private contractor.

There are watering restrictions seven days a week, year round in Jordan. The restrictions include the odd/even system, plus time restrictions.

- Customers whose home or business address ends with an odd number may sprinkle the lawn only on odd numbered days.
- Customers whose home or business address ends with an even number may sprinkle the lawn only on even numbered days.

No sprinkling is permitted between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. A 30-day exception will be allowed for new seed or sod.

Remember most lawns need only 1" of water a week. The best time to water is between 3-9 a.m. when it is the coolest and the least amount of wind.
